Where to check for New or Potential Future Regulation Changes

- Standards Board Mailing List Request Form
- <u>Standards Board Approved Standards Page</u> these are final standards that are now law, or will be very shortly
- <u>Standards Board Emergency Standards Page</u> these are final or proposed standards that are temporary in nature until a permanent regulation can be created
- <u>Standards Board Homepage</u> For potential new standards, look for Proposed Standards or Advisory Committee meetings. Look at other meetings for agendas and decisions.
- <u>Cal/OSHA Rulemaking page</u> For regulations that are decided on by Cal/OSHA (typically administrative-type regulations)
- <u>Cal/OSHA Advisory Committees</u> These committees will draft and discuss proposed health related standards that will be sent to the Standards Board for consideration and adoption.
- <u>State Fund's Safety Resource Center News Page</u> for articles on new standards that affect a large number of businesses
